Welcome everyone to the month of November. November is our reporting month, to help facilitate the reporting process, we have scheduled early dismissals for November 7th- 9th. Students will be dismissed one hour early (1:46 pm) on these days. Classroom teachers will share information about your child. Formative assessment represents the process where teachers, throughout the whole school year, assess what the child knows, is able to do and is learning to do. This information is gathered through tasks that the students perform. Evaluation represents the process of making decisions based on the evidence gathered during assessment for the purpose of goal setting and/or reporting. The teacher or the student may do evaluation independently and in collaboration. Finally, reporting is the process of presenting and communicating about a student's learning and progress, gained through evaluation based on identified standards. The processes of assessment, evaluation and reporting are ongoing.

BOOK FAIR : November 17th - 21st



Socially Responsible Digital Citizen at Lochside School:

There are at times elementary school children coming to school with personal devices in their backpack, whether in the form of a cell phone, tablet, DS or iPod. We would prefer to have all personal devices left at home, for safety reasons.

- During the school day, devices are stored in backpacks and are not in use.
- Students are not to use the cameras on their electronic devices during the school day including the walk or bus ride to or from school.
- Children do not have permission to take pictures of one another other than as directed by a teacher for a school project. Even for this purpose, the school must collect release forms for each student each year if these images are to be posted online in any way. Students cannot give permission to their friends to post images of themselves.

Home:

- Have a chat with your child about responsible usage of social media. It is important that kids understand most anybody can see what is posted to these services and there are often ways around privacy settings. Although your child's use of it might be innocent and appropriate, they are open to comment from anyone. This is not to say that access to these programs should be denied, but rather that conversations and instruction about safe and appropriate usage .
- Possible ideas for guiding conversation or practice of use of social media might include insisting that your child includes you as a follower or "friend" so that you are able to see their posts, having them share their login information with you, and going through the privacy settings with your child to ensure that only people they know are able to interact with them online.

Head Lice Prevention

When we have a report of head lice in a classroom, we usually notify all of the parents/guardians from that class so that they can take the necessary precautions. Although head lice are a nuisance, they are not a health

risk. Head lice cannot jump or fly. Head lice spread quickly by close, head to head contact and by sharing hats, helmets, combs, brushes, etc. Lice cannot live on furniture or carpet. The most common symptom is constant itching of the scalp. You can help by: Teaching your child to not share or borrow hats, hairbrushes, combs, scarves, helmets and hair accessories ; Checking your child's head frequently (every 2 weeks) : Telling the classroom teacher if your child has head lice, so other parents can be notified For more information contact:
