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| Masks Required | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Earlier this morning the Provincial Health Officer, Dr. Bonnie Henry, announced updates to the Provincial COVID-19 Communicable Disease Guidelines for K-12 Settings. Beginning on Mon Oct 4th, <u>all</u> students in B.C. schools will be required to wear a mask. This measure builds on the existing guidelines that currently apply to students in Gr 4-12. Of course, the same exceptions to this guideline will be made for K-Gr 3 students as they have been for Gr 4-12 students in the previous guidelines. • We are currently supplying many students with masks that have been forgotten or lost.
