Writing (20 min or longer)	<p>Writing: Interview Day 1</p> <p><i>Interview a family member or neighbour (virtually or 6 feet away) about their life, about an experience they had, or something they know a lot about.</i></p> <p>Step 1: Use Google Docs (link in Google Classroom) or use paper and pencil and make a list of open-ended questions you might ask your person. Today we are only creating, editing and rewriting our questions. The interview will be tomorrow.</p>	<p>Writing: Interview Day 2</p> <p>Step 2: Today is the interview day! Connect with this person to conduct the interview! Ask your questions and record their main points with jot notes. Don’t forget to thank your person for the interview time.</p>	<p>Writing: Interview Day 3</p> <p>Step 3: Decide how you might share what you learned with others. For example retell to someone else, write an article (biography) or, create a timeline. This is up to you on how you share the interview!</p>	<p>Writing: Interview Day 4</p> <p>Wow! Your interview is done! Look over everything today. Is the writing clear? Have you edited and revised the work?
