Feeding Futures:

- one option would be a breakfast program prepared on site and served for a morning snack around 9
 - would require substantial kitchen upgrades
 - off-site catering would also require a lot of facilities support
 - money would come from staffing (EA budget)
- need to determine how many families need food security support
 - district to prepare survey to identify families in need
 - need to determine culturally responsive foods, allergies, dietary restrictions
- schools are no longer able to distribute grocery gift cards

Clubs

- idea for a km running club

President Report

- coupon books 123 sold
 - LEPAC gets \$12.95 per book
 - books need to be returned by parents who are not purchasing the book
 - staff feedback is that there is stress for families when students who are seeking a prize; prizes should be equitably distributed

School district update

Feeding Futures

- school food programs (three year commitment) about \$800k intended to feed approx 20% of students



- schools to receive a funding allocation and schools will develop a food program plan
- lessons from Affordability Fund, allocations used socio economic data but didn't differentiate enough. Will improve based on knowing how many families were served
- Feeding Futures is focussed on school based meal programs

Transportation Review

- new draft policy to consult more broadly
- Open House in each zone
- policy update over the winter and spring
- lowering the walk limit for elementary from 4 km to 2.5 km
- no separate provincial funding for transportation
- registration fee to encourage on time registration and minimize ghost riders

School Start Up

- all registered students placed
- strong TTOC list
- no uncertified teachers
- no vacancies
- FreshGrade to be replaced by Bright Space; Parent Portal; meeting to introduce parents in November
- Framework for Enhancing Student Learning: 2022 Report available, 2023 to go to Board soon
- Accessibility: committee setting a draft plan, mechanisms to receive feedback including from students
- discussion around mental health and electronic usage/ addiction when technology used in class, is it a barrier?
- School Plans not completed in last three years
- plans under development and each school in transition; not simply a compliance documents
- principals can provide specific updates at a school level
- can expect engagement with PACs this fall
- PAC websites need to be independent and will not be linked through the school
