1. Walk and Wheel to School Week (October 1-5, 2018). We tracked 630 active travelers during this week. Thanks to the CRD and Island Health for hosting the Celebration Stations on Oct. 3. Thanks to Erika and Joan for their support during the week. We will register to participate next year.



- 2. **Fresh To You Fundraiser:** Orders due Oct. 22. Half of the proceeds will support the Grade 5 Camp Thunderbird trip. We currently have only 11 orders. We need 50 orders in order to participate.
- 3. **Games on the Green:** Insufficient parent support to offer this initiative this fall. Considering re-vamping the program to 'Games in the Gym' for January-March. This program would only require parent supervision for free play, 2 mornings/week from 8-8:30 am.

COPAC Rep: Reet Dangerfield & Marissa Cameron

Lochside was represented at the Oct. 11th COPACS meeting by Marissa Cameron. The meeting was attended by COPACs executive, School Board Trustees (Nancy Borden and Barb Menzies), Board Office (Jason Reid), Saanich Teachers Association (Don Peterson) and various COPACs reps from SD63.

Report from Trustees: both Nancy and Barb are moving on, this will be their last meeting. New trustees will be voted in soon. Mark Frazer is leaving the board office. Discussion about how to get funding to update old textbooks that are at some schools and who to contact at district.

Report from Jason Reid: Enrolment increased more than expected for the district, currently up to 7111 students (from 7004 last year) and most of the growth was at elementary schools. White Road property being considered for nature-based Early Childhood Learning centre for ages 3-5. Exploring this option further, including looking at funding options and community support.

Report from STA: FSA coming up for grades 4 and 7. Letters were sent out to all kids in these grades. If you wish to withdraw from these assessments there is paperwork to fill out. It is a bargaining year for STA and this process will likely begin around February to have an agreement by June, when the current contract ends.

Other notes:

- Beyond the Fence Lochside group presented at Educational Directions Committee and the presentation was well received. Suggestions to connect with schools that have done similar projects including Prospect Lake and Kelset (Enchanted Forest) and with Saanich municipality regarding long term maintenance.
