#### Budget Update October 2019 Overview:

- 1. Cash balance is healthy. Details are as follows:
  - Gift Cards Country Grocer \$238
  - Petty Cash \$400 Float
  - Gaming account \$155.92
  - General account \$34348.06 (Cleared \$36658.91 less outstanding transactions of \$2310.85)
- 2. Fun Lunch Program Total net proceeds received less expenses to date total \$26,608.
- 3. Popcorn Total net received less expenses of \$1,217
- 4. Smile Card Program lost their coordinator. They have rehired but the program approvals are behind schedule. Expect this to get approved this month. Also, will send out reminders of the procedure to all parents
- 5. Gaming Grant expect to be received prior to Christmas.
- 6. Signing authorities for the bank have been changed

Report from Dave Eberwein (Superintendent, SD 63):

- Policy 1100 Parent Involvement Meeting meeting scheduled for November 7th at Bayside Middle School. All parents are welcome to join members of the Parent Advisory Council executives along with district executive, administrators, trustees and partner group representatives for our annual parent involvement meeting. This meeting, as described in Board Policy 1100 - Parent Involvement, occurs every fall so that we can review district and ministry directions and the key role of parents and PACs. A district policy review is currently underway. The district is hoping for 4-5 parent/school to attend. They are also looking for suggestions to change the name of this meeting from Policy 1100 to ....?

- CUPE negotiations are still continuing/ongoing

#### Report from Jason Reid (Secretary/Treasurer SD 63):

- enrolment is up for 2019-2020, above what was forecasted and is mainly in the elementary schools. Lochside and Prospect Lake are at full capacity.

- Currently the district is undergoing a boundary review. This will take some time to complete, but the hope is that it will improve alignment.

- funding formula changes will happen in Sept 2020. COPACs has been involved in these conversations, but currently we don't know the impact of these results. Funding

is enrolment based (7.4K/Student FTE). 85% of the district funding comes from enrolment.

#### - other reports:

- Vancouver Island Parent Conference, Feb 29, 2020 at Belmont Secondary. COPACs will fund attendance for up to 2 attendees per school.

- James Taylor (co-prez of COPACs) is wiling to attend school PAC meetings in support of COPACs and BCCPAC. If there is interest in a PAC 101 type session these can be arranged for PAC executives.
