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We have almost made it all the way through a whole school year living with Covid-19. It has been both a challenge with our reduced sense of community but has also shone a light on how resilient we all are. We are very proud to be a part of this Lochside family.

Some of the ways we have had to be flexible this year include the changes in our monthly meetings. We started our year hosting meetings both in-person, spaced out in the gym with a Zoom option. This honestly was very challenging. We then made the decision to host our meetings completely on Zoom. As much as we missed the face-to-face meetings, it was obviously necessary and I think we still did a great job with maintaining our communication and personal connections.

We were unable to do a lot of our big revenue generators this year in order to keep our school safe. The biggest loss was our Fun Lunch Sales. The Halloween Dance and other community events were also big social losses due to the Pandemic. Instead of being the close community we usually are, we had to continually remind ourselves about social distancing. This was also the first year that we ran a deficit budget and dipped into our savings to support essential things that our children and staff so greatly benefit from. We are thankful to previous LEPAC leadership that allowed us to be in a fairly comfortable financial position to run this year as normally as possible.

### Treasurer's Report: Mei Wang

• Based on a tough year LEPAC did an amazing job. We ended up breaking even for the year and not using the approved deficit of \$15,000.



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- Revenues were over \$12,200. (including families donations of over \$5,700, and holiday chocolate sales of over \$3,600.
- Revenues were down \$17,400 (59%) compared to the previous year, largely due to the inability to do Fun Lunch, the Halloween dance and other fundraising events and activities that would usually take place.
- We have done last year's Fun Lunch refund of \$4,657.75 and carry forward over \$7,700 in revenues from last year.
- The Thrifty Smile Cards will end June 2021. We have received funding of \$797.95. Budgeted was \$800.
- Country Grocer Gift Cards have received \$800. Budgeted was \$1,500.
- Year to date financials attached to AGM minutes.

### Financial status as of May 2021:

- Cash balance is healthy. Details are as follows:
  - o Gift Cards Country Grocer \$711.42
  - o Petty Cash \$400.00
  - o Gaming account \$11,843.42
  - o General account \$24,663.52 (Cleared \$26,148.19 less outstanding transactions \$1,484.67.( including last year \$223.39).
- Gaming Fund- Remaining Payments
  - o Field Trip (\$6,450.00. 430\*\$15.)
  - o Expected surplus to carry forward \$5,393.42.
- Expected cash balance at the end of the year is expected to be just over \$24,600.
  - o Balance at the beginning of the year was \$24,500.
- Some expenses this year include:
  - o Reimbursed the teachers Classroom Budget \$4,681.74 (82%)
  - o Indoor Silent Bikes \$6,703.20.(from Gaming \$3,500; from General \$3,203.20.)
  - o Earthquake supplies \$485.75
  - o Seaguaria \$1,401.75
  - o Reflex math \$2,395.00
