- Lochside Apparel
 - Would like to do apparel for the school and for Grade 5s right after Thanksgiving. Admin says this can proceed.

Question and Answers

Q: When kids become symptomatic if kids must stay home what resources are available

A: There will be a classroom specific package from the teacher

Q: If there is another lockdown is the school prepared for remote learning?

A: Have not had this dialogue yet, but it will be discussed at management meetings coming up.

Q: Cold & flu season is coming. If students have symptoms what happens?

A: If normal ongoing symptom (e.g. Asthmatic coughing), no real concern. If it is a novel or new symptom families will be asked to come get their child and contact 811 and follow their instructions. A note is preferred but not required.

Q: SD61 has a hybrid model, will our district be offering this?

A: haven't had this discussion at the district, but they are looking to other districts for models that have worked well.

Q: About ½ a year of learning was lost due to the strike and Covid will there be assessments for the children to find their level?

A: Assessments are done at the beginning of every year. Teachers will meet the students where they are at.



Q: If there is an outbreak among the teachers what is the plan?

A: If there is a Covid case in the school Admin will follow the instructions from Island Health. If teacher has a positive Covid case they will have a sub and the info will be communicated.

Q: How many people are the children coming into contact with?

A: 40-56 people in a cohort. A Cohort is 2 classes that can interact. Cohorts are being kept separate from each other, even on the playground.

Q: What happens if Lochside has a Covid outbreak

A: We follow the instructions of Island Health.

Q: What is the timeline for contact tracing

A: We don't know, this is a question for Island Health

Q: Why is arrival and dismissal not staggered?

A: We are not able to at this time, but nothing is stopping a child from wearing a mask.
