Wednesday/Thursday contractors will put ducting back together. 5. District staff will go in while it remains closed and replace any lighting that is dim or burnt out. 6. Once the test is complete and ducting is put back together the gym can be opened, we will continue to work on the new drainage the following week.

- BCCPAC Conference & AGM
 - o Virtual this year, coming up April 29 & 30

- Food Guide Survey
 - o Province seeking feedback on changes to guidelines around food sold or served in schools
 - o Move from a most / sometimes / never recommended list to an outright ban on certain foods
 - o Concern from the PAC about interference with fundraising events involving food that then impedes the PAC's ability to raise much-needed funds for the school and provide fun, social events that do have foods that are "treats"
 - Food served or sold by PAC also involved parental choice about whether to participate

Treasurer's Report: Melissa Joyce

- Healthy bank account balance about \$32,000
- Over \$10,000 in gaming account
- About \$600 raised from the recent bottle drive
- Melissa went over what was included in the budget and what is left to be used so far to date so that Tom and Leila are aware
 - Tom noted that if there is money available that tents would be a great addition for the earthquake supplies as well as for use for events as needed
 - Category for "musical instrument repair" was moved and approved to be changed to "musical instruments" to be more flexible in covering both repairs and purchases
 - Leila purchased some grad apparel for some Grade 5 families so this will be looked at when the order arrives for LEPAC to cover this from the student in need funds
 - Some extra spirit wear was ordered with the spring order for school admin to have and distribute at their discretion to students in need
 - Guiding statement to be developed for the use of the student in need fund
 - Discussion about broadening the appeal during the Christmas wish drive to sponsor students in need beyond just fun lunch
- Melissa reminded the admin to please ask the teachers to submit their receipts for their classroom budgets before the end of the year.
