Class Building	 There is always the question of the practice of not placing teacher names beside classrooms. In some situations, it doesn't feel fully transparent as people can deduce which teacher is where through looping practices, IEP placements, etc. This was a district decision for the following reasons: It prevents the possibility of a class list somehow becoming public or seeming to be solidified prior to summer. As we are all experiencing,
	summer brings new registrations and for some buildings, this could mean reconfigurations. So, we want to keep this looking like student groupings and drafts of the beginning of classes and not a sense of a done deal.
	 The class placement process needs to be done with intentionality for the child in mind. Keeping teacher names off the lists promotes the focus on student placement and student needs. This may seem like a technicality, but the philosophy behind it is, I believe, an important distinction. This brings consistency across elementary schools.
