 - Total enrollment is 436 with 20 divisions
 - Pretty close to the maximum in all divisions

- Lucky to have a police liaison officer again this year, shared between 9 schools. He'll be coming to do crossing guard training
- Parent visitors will be welcome for the Terry Fox Run this year
 - If possible, LEPAC will do fruit for the students and will get volunteers for this.
- Staff are keen to support the Card Project again this year in time for Xmas; Anya will send out some details for any new staff members with guidelines for the art work and how the fundraiser works.
- Staff will do the welcome back picnic on Sept 22:
 - 4:30 6:30
 - Teachers in their classes from 4:30 to 5:30 for families to have a tour, meet the staff in their classes
 - Picnic between 5:30 and 6:30 (families to bring their own)
 - Eva will look into Mr Tube Steak to see if they might be available to come

 - o Have done elaborate events in the past (pre-COVID).
 - o Last year a simpler, outdoor event was held to find pumpkins to unscramble a phrase with pizza available for sale. Hoping to do something similar this year.
 - Well-attended but finding volunteers was challenging
 - Currently no one on Exec to coordinate so seeking a parent to take this on. Stay tuned for a Sign-Up Genius
- Child Minding
 - o If we are able to find a babysitter LEPAC will look into offering child minding again for PAC meetings.
 - o Have a lead and Leila kindly offered her classroom to use if needed.
- Card Project
 - o Each child will do a piece of art that will be printed on a card and other items. Has to be ready for October 14
 - o Ordering from Oct 28 to November 6
 - o Cards / items delivered at the end of November
 - o Anya will be coordinating this with help from Amy

 - o Orders sorted late Nov / early Dec
 - o Delivery in early December

Treasurer's Report: Melissa Joyce (regrets)

- Anya presented the proposed budget, a deficit of about \$7,000 is proposed to bring down our bank account balance. LEPAC has a very healthy savings and would like to see the funds go to the school community.
- Note to adjust the revenue from Monk's to reflect the actuals
 - Feedback to communicate to families that the list has been streamlined to increase participation for next year.
 - Some parents present commented that they had opted out so as not to have so many unused items come home as they were not aware that the lists had been pared down.
- Adjust the classroom budgets to include French, Music, ELL and Inclusion Support teachers as well
- Reduce the amount for earthquake supplies as only some water will need to be replaced this year
- No Seaquaria program this year, on a one-year pause so will look into something else for the aquarium instead to use those gaming account funds (\$1,700).
 - Leila will consult with Tom about options for those funds

- Would like to spend some money for a LEPAC sign to be used at events.
