COPACS Rep Report: Amy Wang (regrets)

- The Education Ministry allocated \$60 million one-time funding to districts around food security, to be spent by the end of June 2023. Saanich has received over \$735,000; Lochside's portion is approximately \$65,000.
 - Leila commented that the admin has started working with the Learning Support team to come up with ways to use the funds to help families in need in our community.
 - District survey will be coming out to help identify families
- COPAC is organizing some new committees if anyone is interested in participating
 - o eg Parent Education, Climate Change, etc.

Other Business

- Staff appreciation shift to something once per month rather than the week in May?
 - Asked for feedback from Leila and she commented that the time in May makes it more special than the ongoing, monthly thing.
